**Create Sustainability Across Finances, Staffing, and Programs:** SVP will launch and complete our Reimagine Campaign to increase revenue, enabling investments in resources that ensure our long-term success.

impact 18 million in community-led organizations, we aim to double our Partners, grow our grantees by 200%, and increase our volunteer support by 400% in the next three years.
